BE FILLED WITH COMFORT AND JOY THIS SEASON...

Here is "A Christmas Morning Tradition at the Logan's" ... submitted by 2016 Reunion Chair, Sharon Logan (a partial reprint from 2016 BLS Family Reunion Commemorative Program)



For the past 12 years, every Christmas morning my girls have kept this tradition alive. It starts at 6:00 AM when the girls awaken us to start the morning. As we sit around the Christmas tree, we prepare to open our presents. With coffee, tea, and hot chocolate drinks of our choice, we share gifts, laughs, and take pictures as we open each presents. Once all of the presents are open, we partake in a serving of our Christmas Morning Traditional Bread Pudding.

BREAD PUDDING

- 6 slices of day(s) old bread (I typically use a mixture of sliced wheat bread and dinner rolls)
- 2 TB Butter
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 4 eggs, beaten
- 2 cups of milk
- 3/4 cups of white sugar
- 1/2 cup of brown sugar
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp vanilla extract



Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Break bread into small pieces into a baking dish. Drizzle melted butter over bread. Sprinkle with raisins. In a separate dish, combine eggs, milk, white sugar, brown sugar, cinnamon, and vanilla extract in a mixing bowl. Beat until well mixed. Pour over bread and lightly push down with fork until the bread is covered and soaking up the egg mixture. Bake in oven for 45 minutes or until the top springs back when lightly topped.

BREAD PUDDING SAUCE

- 2/3 cups sugar
- 2 TB all-purpose flour
- 1 cup water
- 7 TB butter
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

In a saucepan, combine sugar, flour, and water until smooth. Add butter. Bring to boil over medium heat, cook, and stir for 2 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in the vanilla. Serve warm or cold over bread pudding and enjoy it with a hot drink of your favorite beverage.

MEET GWEN PATRICK: MEMBER 2018 FAMILY REUNION PLANING COMMITTEE

Gwen is the second oldest daughter of Clabert (Steve) Batiste. She has always lived in California and in the year 2008, she was a candidate for the State Assembly. Gwen and her husband Pastor Charles Patrick have five children, Gentry, Jessica, Charles III, Hope and John Paul. Gwen and Pastor Charles led a congregation in Compton, California known as Sunago Christian Fellowship Church, and now have started a new ministry vision to reach youth of this generation through Foundations For Future Generations (FFFG) in New Berry Springs, California.

In a recent update to supporters, Gwen and Pastor Charles say that in less than one year God moved to grow the vision of FFFG “by leaps and bounds!” The various FFFG programs will all emphasize character development and development of employable skills in an academic environment.

Now there is a newly completed lake expansion for fishing. The lake will open spring 2017 for fishing catfish, tilapia, and more. FFFG occasionally employs local college students and ministries (Victory Outreach Ministries) to help beautify and maintain the property. The grounds are also home to a colony of endangered Tri-Colored Blackbirds. The colony gets active with nesting and roosting from early spring through mid-Summer. Because of the Tri-Colored Blackbird, Gwen and Pastor Charles, in partnership with the Audubon Society and affiliates, bring regular visitors and supporters to the grounds.

The most recent exciting news is a grant of \$10,000 from USDA to build two greenhouses to fulfill the horticultural, agricultural, and aquaponics visions of FFFG. Two 1500 square foot structures, scheduled for construction this winter, are foundational for the “outdoor classroom” component of FFFG to invite communities to enjoy the natural habitat of Newberry Springs.
